
WHAT WOULD YOU DO? - WEEK 8




I was impressed with Jeff's positive intent, and having played against him recently, I know he'd be able to pull this shot off!

Week 8 scenario. (I would like to acknowledge that these scenarios are from the WA Bowls website)



Scenario: You are the pink bowls

- You are playing in a Pennant Game (3 rinks) and are approx. halfway through (35 ends played)
- You are leading 13-7 and have played 11 ends on your rink.
- You are leading the **overall aggregate by 3** with one rink down and the other equal.
- You are currently **2 down** and calling your second on his 2nd Bowl. His first is the bowl on the right.
- A light gusty breeze is blowing across the green from right to left as we are looking at it.
- The green is running approx. 14 seconds and is reasonably wide for the pace.
- The backhand (right handers) is slightly narrower but still drawing well although it does have a couple of tricks.
