From The President

A big warm hello to everyone. A few things are happening at the moment, with the Shire finally giving us some good indications regarding their plans in dealing with some of our pressing issues. And I don't need to remind you again of what they are!

Firstly, regarding the concreting around the walkway to, and surroundings of, the entrance area of the club rooms. Amelia and I met with the contractor for the Shire yesterday, and he assured us that work is to begin either tomorrow (Friday) or Monday of next week. As a result, there will be no access to the club through the front gate, while the front doors will also be locked and not to be used for entry. The Notice Board sheets for Monday Triples, Thursday and Saturday social events will be transferred to the boards in the bar area, and all entry to the club should be made through the back car park gate, and then via the sun deck entrance. This arrangement will continue over the next 2-3 weeks while the concreting job is undertaken and completed. So that is one piece of good news!

Secondly, Derrik, Phil and myself met the Project Manager from the Mornington Peninsula Shire, Isaac, who brought along a consultant from Melbourne with the view of specifying remedial action needing to be done in order to "cure" the subsidence on the Duggan green. The main positive we gained from this meeting is that the Shire is totally committed to solving the problem, with a retaining wall planned to extend adjacent to Stawell Street turning at right angles into the bushland parallel to Latrobe Parade. This wall will extend as far as the shelter near the female toilet behind the Hildebrand Green. The estimation from Isaac is that planning and costings should be completed sometime in September, with work to start.....eventually. Still, I regard this as a win of sorts, with the long-term future of the green in question being assured. There will be major work being done around the Duggan Green, and we may face some unsightly machinery moving to and from, but at least we know it is all going to get done!!! Win Number 2 I believe.

No news yet on the ongoing saga regarding re-surfacing of the Hildebrand Green, but after a number of phone calls to Deputy Mayor Debra Mar I believe that we are moving closer to gaining the permission required for the commencement of this major project. We are not quite there yet, but with a little more prodding hopefully things will start to move. Stay tuned.

More sad news this week with the passing of a very popular member and Pennant bowler, Alan Parker. Alan passed away last week in Queensland, age 77, after a long battle with illness that never stopped him from bowling and socialising, as best he was able, with the best of them at Dromana. Alan Parker joined Dromana Bowls Club in 2014 and spread his playing time between our club and Alphington over the next decade, depending on whether he called the City or the Peninsula home base at the time! A very popular and enthusiastic member of our club, Alan was a key member of our Division 2 Premiership side in 2021/22, and he gained a great deal of pleasure from this victory. Tragically, both he and Kevin Vorbach, both proud members of this side, have been taken from us far too early. Vale Alan Parker. The club offers its sincere condolences to his family during this very sad time.

Apologies also for the missing text in last week's Newsletter, the captions relating to Graeme Mills and his team from 2015 did not appear, but by now I hope everyone remembers Graeme and his time at the club, and once again we extend our sympathies to his family. He was always great fun to bowl with, Graeme, and a great servant of the Hawthorn Football Club in his role as doorman over many years. Like too many of our members who have passed away in recent times, he will be remembered fondly.

On the social front, the club has committed to hosting two quite large functions over the next couple of months. On Saturday, September 2nd, a fund-raising event for a local family affected by illness will be held. The Dromana Basketball club is helping a young family suffering from the dreadful repercussions of cancer, and we are most happy to donate our facilities to such a worthwhile cause. At this stage the proposed Trivia Night will take place between 6.00-10.00pm, and it would be appreciated if all RSA holders would let myself, David Baud, Amelia or Carmel Healy know whether you can help out for an hour or so on the night. Even if you can't work behind the bar, all hands-on deck in any capacity would be most appreciated. Please just let us know if you can help.

Similarly, a social event for 30 or so "young ladies" has been booked for Friday, October 6th, with staff needed to man the bar as well as helping out on the greens. Once again, your co-operation will be appreciated!
