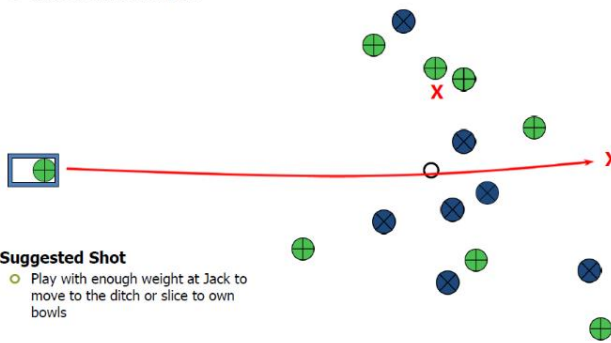
WHAT WOULD YOU DO? - WEEK 17


Last week's WWYD? Week 17 pictured right. Suggested shot indicated in Red. Explanation underneath.

A draw shot at best would only get one, most likely to go down 1 or 2. An "Up-Shot" trailing the jack gives the best chance of getting 2 or more shots and as suggested on the diagram if the jack is sliced sideways, you could also pick up a few shots. Also, the opponent has 1 bowl left so a draw probably would not work.

Scenario A4: – You have the bowls

- One down on the master score board and this is the last End
 -  What shot would you play?




- Suggested Shot
 -  Play with enough weight at Jack to move to the ditch or slice to own bowls

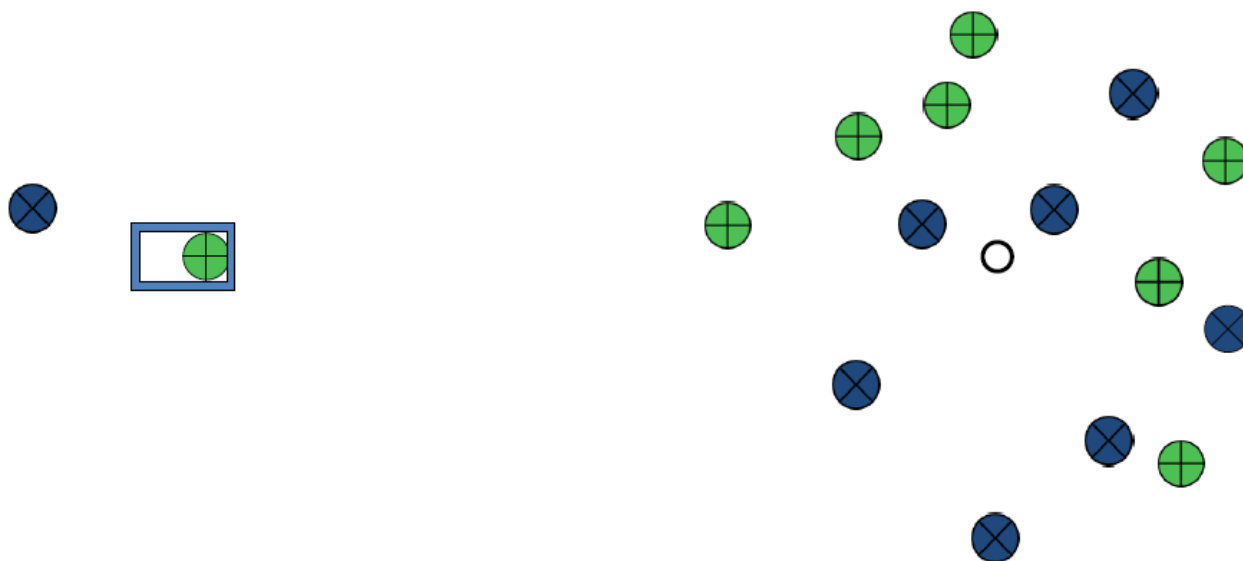
Which shot would you be **most confident** of playing?

8.1.6 Prior to the last three rounds of Sectional play there will be no restriction on the interchange of Players between the Sides of a Club.

8.1.7 For the last three rounds of Sectional play, no Side will include more than three players who have played the majority of their games, prior to the third last game, in a higher division Side or for clubs with sides in the same division, the side assigned a lower number (i.e. higher ability).

8.1.8 In any Post-sectional match a Side will not include any Player who, during the current season, has played less than four games for the Club in that actual competition. The Saturday Pennant competition and the Midweek Open Pennant competition are separate competitions and games played in one competition do not count towards Player eligibility in the other competitions. (Refer to Rule 7.4 'Divisional Play' of these Rules for Competition)

8.1.9 In any Post-sectional match, a Side will not include any Player who, during the current MPBR - Rules for Competition 2023-24 v1.0 Page 16 season, has played more than four games in any combination of higher grade sides unless that player has played in four or more games in the side concerned and/or a lower grade side.

8.1.10 If any Club is uncertain of having available sufficient Members who are eligible under Rule 8.1.8 of these Rules for Competition, it can apply to the MPBR Match Committee for approval to play other players from the Club, and if approval is granted such players can play in any position other than Skip.
