


ACTIVITY 7- DRAW TO SAVE


Place the mat on T

Make it easier by moving the bowls further away from the jack or more difficult by moving the bowls closer to the jack







ACTIVITY 8 – DRAW TO OFF CENTRE JACK

Place the mat on T &


1 jack off centre at 29m

1 jack off centre at 26m





A lovely friendly group that appreciated our beautiful welcoming venue. Yes, a cruise ship came down the bay.




