

- **Keep a record of your scores.** This will help to identify patterns and areas of strength and areas of development. It will also help you to monitor your progress.






From Jeff Dardel:

We are in quite a vulnerable situation!





TONY'S CHAT WITH BARB FLATHER (Pictured right)






