Equipment needed 1 mat, 1 jack & 1 bowl

Draw to the jack ignoring the short bowl. Choose one hand and play four bowls. Then repeat on the other hand.

Make it easier by moving the bowls further away from the jack or more difficult by moving the bowls closer to the jack MAT

Play four bowls on the forehand and four bowls on the backhand to meet the objective of adding to the count






WHAT WOULD YOU DO? - WEEK 19

Probably, best not to get into this situation first!!!




Which shot would you be most confident of playing?

Holidays\Places visited or planned: Visited over 45 countries, favourites Vietnam 1, Croatia and Poland . In Australia — anywhere near the beach!




