





Last week's WWYD? Week 26 (B3) pictured right. Suggested shot indicated in Red. Explanation underneath.









Mount Eliza v Dromana Division 2N

WOW. The 'Twos' have defeated the highly fancied Mt Eliza side to win the Division 2 North flag on Saturday at Karingal. We played on the lower green at Karingal and it ran as well as or even better than the other green last week. Congratulations to Karingal and thanks for presenting the green in such condition.

The final result 89 shots to 83 was the culmination of six weeks of 'finals' whereby we had to win every one to progress. We went into the tea break leading 53 to 45 after 55 ends and despite the mini comeback by the 'Pellies' we held on to record a magnificent win. We should not lose sight of the fact that we were playing Mt Eliza's

number one side who had defeated us twice during the home and away rounds. Our side played with great heart, never wavering in the face of a determined opposition who were hell bent on gaining promotion to Division one.

Allan Voice and his 'harem' (as Mal Price referred to them), Gill Fletcher, Wendy Hegarty and Ann Maree Ryan faced an onslaught by their opposition early and were down 20 zip after 9 ends. To their eternal credit they did not lose heart, their ability shone through and they fought back to take the remainder of the game 20 shots to 13. They played no small part in our win. They had not played badly early but the opposition bowled exceedingly well. They were holding 5 or 6 shots on one end when their skip drew the absolute. All players lifted in a great second half gaining four 'threes' in their comeback.

Dennis Ryan and his rink of Paul 'Hello' Vercoe, Lou Taylor and Brian Kettels were up against a top rink skipped by Mike Pearce and held them to record a 21-23 result. What a great effort. They were not fazed by the opposition and everyone contributed to the result. Paul got us off to a good start on most ends, Lou put in his usual good game, Brian played some great bowls on many occasions and Dennis finished off the game well. We were down all day recovering from 0-6 after 4 ends to catch up to 7-9, were down 11-20 after 17 ends and finished strongly over the last 8 ends winning 10 shots to 3. Another determined effort by the lads.

Lloyd 'last game' Schulz and his team of Les Webb, Peter Pearson and George Watts led all day to record a 22-13 win. We got off to a flyer leading 8-0 after 5 ends and led 17-2 after 13 ends. We went into the tea break 17-5 up. We only scored 5-8 after the break but we did not let them score multiples. Les got us off to a good start on most ends with his ability to correct shining through. Peter played a good contributing game again.
