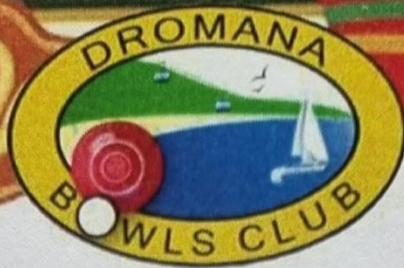

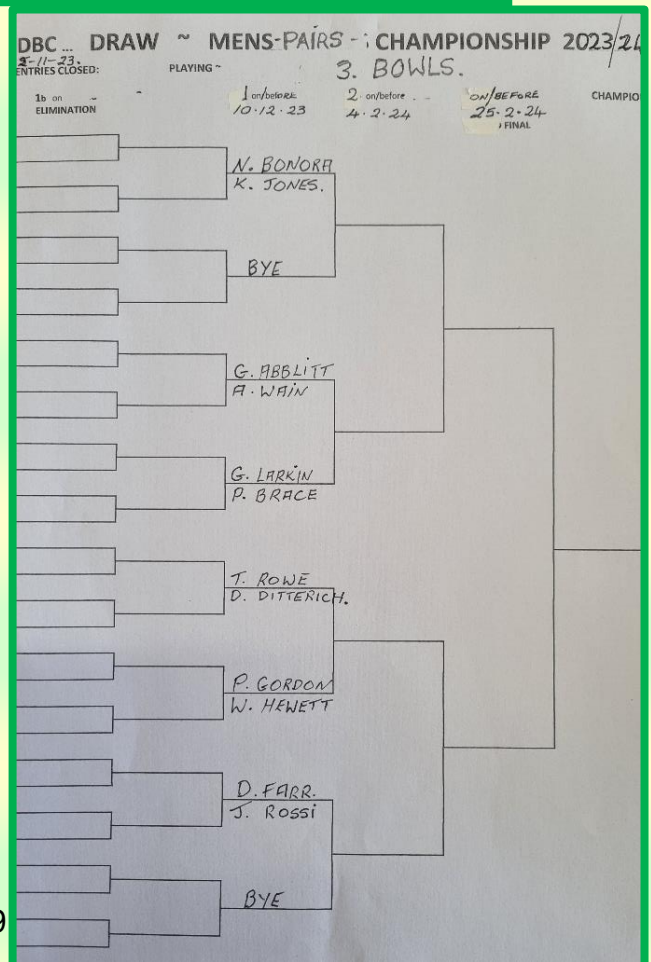

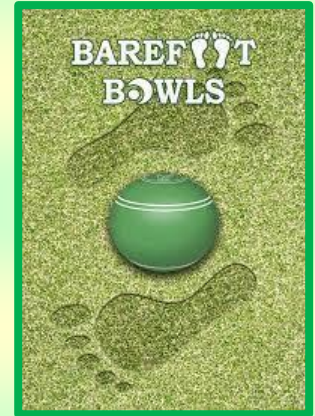
Barefoot Bowls

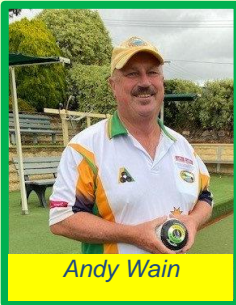

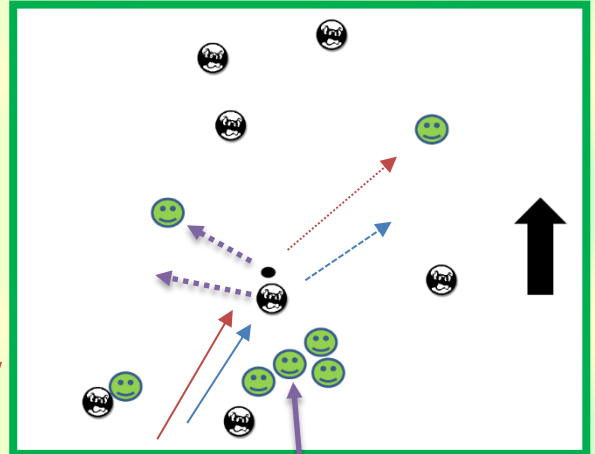

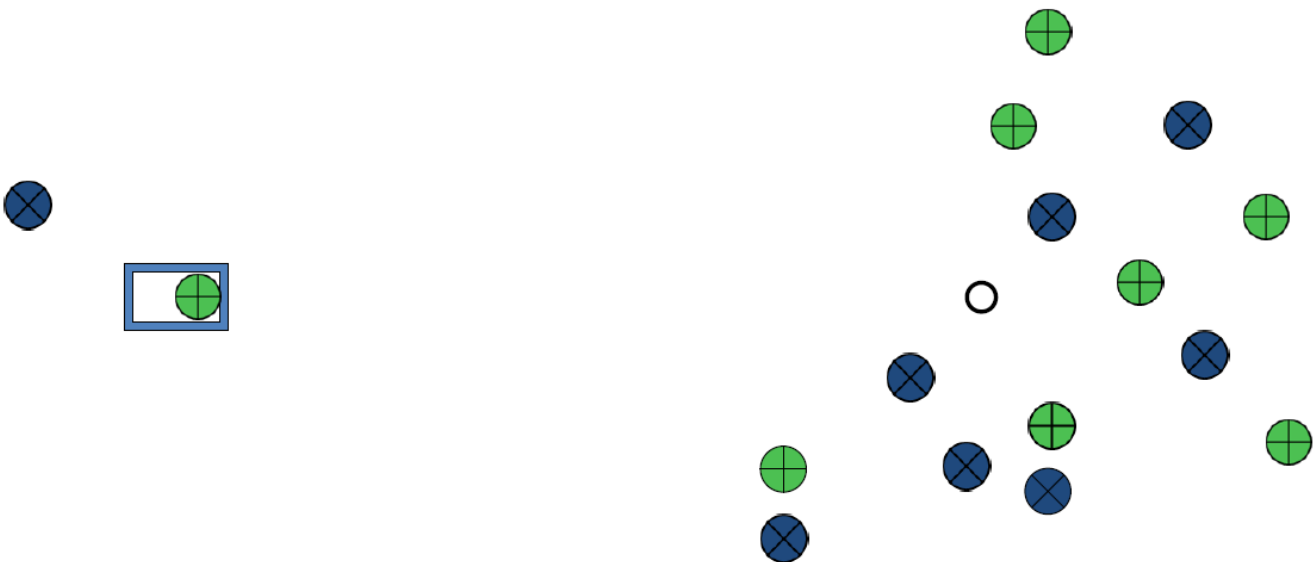
Which shot would you be **most confident** of playing?

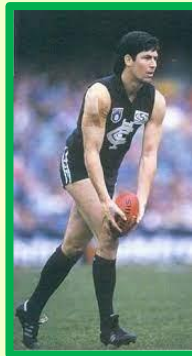

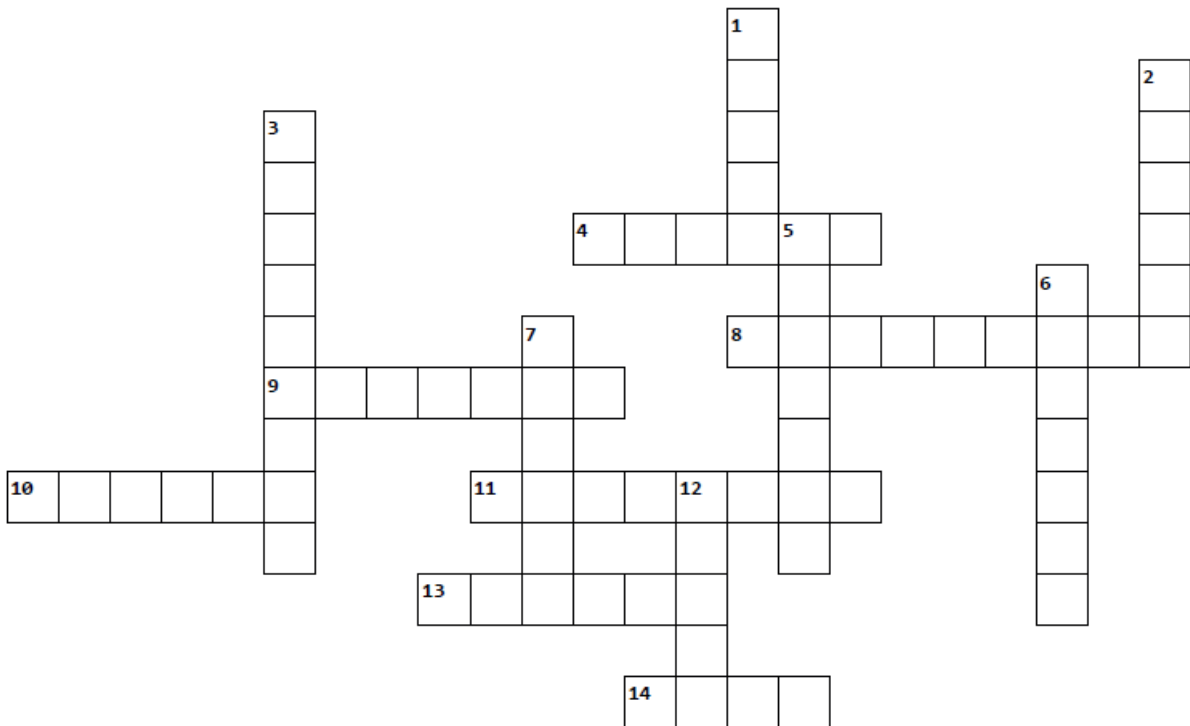

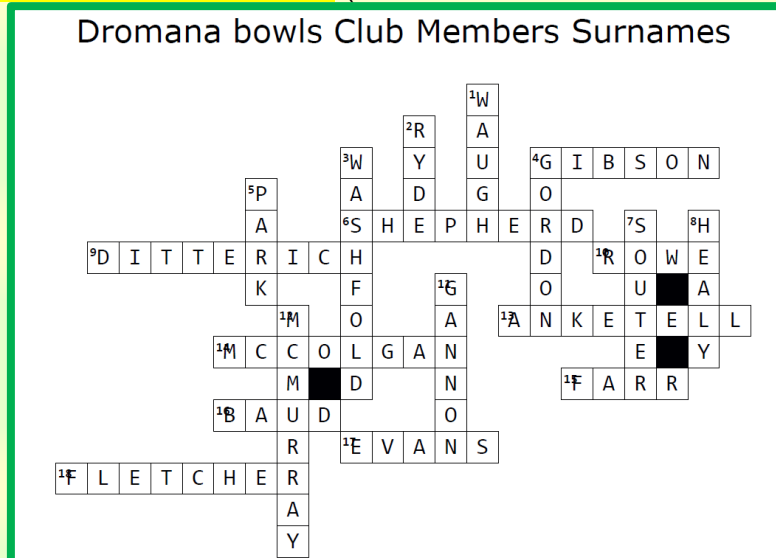
