Next week the **Board** will also be reviewing the recommendations of the Committee which was set up to look at ways of utilising the **Pauline**

Brain bequest.

My thanks in advance to Bernie Smith, Carmel Healy, and Jeff Dardel for their responsible approach to dealing with the daunting task of how best to move forward with the prudent dispersal of these funds. Their commitment to their brief has been most professional, and I look forward to sharing the results of this work with you, the members.

A big shout out to **Phil Carter** this week for the fantastic work he is doing in the re-cycling area, sorting through all our "empties" in order to cash in on the current program. All good for the club, and all in a good environmental sense as well. Thanks for your involvement and hard work in this area **Phil**, along with all other members who are currently helping.

So that is it, once again, for another week. My congratulations to **Dromana 3** players who put in such a magnificent performance during the Pennant season, only to fall narrowly (5 shots) at the last hurdle. You have served the club brilliantly and deserved to make it to the final week. Certainly a good sign for next season!!




Barefoot Bowls






